Master of Science (Applied)-Nursing - for students with no previous nursing experience

No nursing background? No problem! If you have a Bachelor's degree in another field, this unique program was established with you in mind. Over a 10-month bridge period, the courses in our Qualifying Year (QY) will prepare you for graduate level nursing studies. After successful completion of the QY, you can choose the Direct Entry to Advanced Practice Nursing concentration or our Global Health Direct Entry concentration, which includes a clinical placement in a low resource setting in Canada or abroad.

Master of Science (Applied)-Advanced Nursing

If you have a Bachelor's in nursing and want to "level up", this program is for you. With its emphasis on guiding students to bring the best available evidence to nursing practice within a variety of health care settings, this program will help you develop policy, leadership and nursing education skills. Choose from three concentrations: Advanced Practice Nursing (APN), Nursing Service Administration (NSA) or Global Health (GHC).

Nurse Practitioner (NP) Program

If you are a licensed nurse with a Bachelor's or Master's in nursing with a minimum of two years of clinical experience, consider expanding your scope of practice as a Nurse Practitioner. Our NP program is the first of its kind in Quebec to offer 5 concentrations: primary care, adult care, mental health, pediatrics and neonatal.
