Northern College is seeking a Professor, Nursing in our School of Health Sciences and Emergency Services department. The successful candidate will be a knowledgeable and approachable team member with a commitment to excellence in Health Sciences education and student success, be committed to supporting student success, and play a role in supporting ongoing research and scholarship. A PhD in Nursing and/or Ph D in Science with experience in an acute/longterm care setting is preferred. Also preferred is valid Certification in ACLS, ATLS, PALS and NRP, knowledge or experience with CASN/CNO accreditation processes, certification/training/professional development with simulation in a teaching environment, teaching experience using a variety of modes of delivery (video, web-based, etc.) and methodologies, experience with NCLEX structure and teaching preparation requirements, and lastly, experience in Nursing/Science/ Healthcare related research/scholarship.
